## Lewiston Consolidated Schools <br> School Board Meeting Minutes <br> January 15, 2020

A regular meeting of the Lewiston School Board District 69 was held on Wednesday, January 15th, at 7:00 p.m. This meeting was open to the public and preceded in notice as required by law. The meeting was called to order by President Aaron Rule and he verbally acknowledged the Open Meetings Law poster on the wall and that the meeting was recorded. Roll call found the following members to be present: Husa, Janssen, Rule, Searcey and Sisco. Excused Absence: Schuster. Also present: Rick Kentfield, Juli Smith, Linda Thomas, and several visitors.

The agenda was reviewed. Moved by Searcey and seconded by Janssen "to approve the agenda as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Janssen, Rule, Searcey, Sisco, Husa. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0. Visitors were welcomed. Five visitors shared information with the board of education.

The board conducted an election for 2020 President of the Board. Moved by Husa and seconded by Sisco "to nominate Rule for 2020 President of the School Board." Moved by Sisco and seconded by Husa "to cease nominations." Ballots by the board were cast and Aaron Rule was elected President by a 5-0 vote.

President Rule continued the officer elections. Moved by Rule and seconded by Sisco "to nominate Husa for Vice President of the School Board." Moved by Rule and seconded by Janssen "to nominate Searcey for Vice President of the School Board." Moved by Sisco and seconded by Searcey "to cease nominations." Ballots by the board were cast and Linda Searcey was elected Vice President by a 3-2 vote. Moved by Searcey and seconded by Rule "to nominate Janssen for 2020 Treasurer of the School Board." Moved by Husa and seconded by Rule "to nominate Sisco for 2020 Treasurer of the School Board." Moved by Sisco and seconded by Rule "to nominate Schuster for 2020 Treasurer of the School Board." Moved by Husa and seconded by Searcey "to cease nominations." Ballots by the board were cast and Janssen was elected by a 3-2 vote. Moved by Husa and seconded by Sisco "to appoint Rick Kentfield as 2020 Secretary of the School Board." Those voting in favor of said motion: Rule, Searcey, Sisco, Husa, Janssen. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Moved by Rule and seconded by Janssen "to approve the December 13, 2019, school board meeting minutes as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Searcey, Sisco, Husa, Janssen, Rule. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

The treasurer's report was presented by Steve Janssen, and Rick Kentfield presented the monthly claims, payroll, and transfers. Discussion was held. Moved by Husa and seconded by Janssen "to approve the January treasurer's report, January payroll and claims as presented in the amount of $\$ 285,763.61$, and the transfer of $\$ 20,000.00$ from General Fund to Lunch Fund." Those voting in favor of said motion: Searcey, Sisco, Husa, Janssen, Rule. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Rick Kentfield, Superintendent, addressed conflict of interest laws for board members. The necessary paperwork was completed and will be kept on file at the school office. Discussion was held regarding board committees. School board members discussed committees of interest and President Rule made final committee assignments. Mr. Kentfield updated the board on facility projects and presented Engineering Technologies Inc. site investigation on the school's HVAC system.

Moved by Rule and seconded by Husa "to approve forming a school board committee to evaluate the PeeWee basketball program." Those voting in favor of said motion: Sisco, Husa, Janssen, Rule, Searcey. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Moved by Husa and seconded by Sisco "to approve extending Rick Kentfield's superintendent contract to the 2021-2022 school year." Those voting in favor of said motion: Husa, Janssen, Rule, Searcey, Sisco. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Discussion was held. Moved by Rule and seconded by Husa "to approve Rick Kentfield's Superintendent salary of \$123,796.00 for the 2020-2021 school year." Those voting in favor of said motion: Janssen, Rule, Searcey, Sisco, Husa. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Juli Smith, Principal, shared information on Heather Campbell, Art Teacher, receiving a $\$ 5,000.00$ Hevelone grant for gym curtains, student testing, class schedules, MUDECAS basketball tournament, and upcoming junior high and high school dance.

Rick Kentfield, Superintendent, discussed board election information, secured verbal approval to re-install a coach's shower, shared that the new ADA exterior doors had been installed, informed the board a new lunch room dishwasher has been ordered, shared President's Retreat workshop information, Legislative Issues Conference information, option enrollment information, levy information, and upcoming February meeting agenda items.

Board Committee report - No reports at this time. Pee-Wee committee will meet Monday, January 20, 2020, at 7:00 p.m.
Moved by Husa and seconded by Searcey "to adjourn at 10:05 p.m." Those voting in favor of said motion: Rule, Searcey, Sisco, Husa, Janssen. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

## Seniors...make sure you complete the FAFSA process

Getting financial aid for college involves more than completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Complete each step of the process so that you don't miss out on money for college.

1. If you haven't already, complete your 2020-21 FAFSA at FAFSA.gov using 2018 income tax data. Before you start, you and a parent must each get an FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov as you'll need them to access and sign your FAFSA.
2. Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR) via an email link. The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received and lets you know if you need to take further action before the form can be processed.
3. You might receive a verification notice from the college(s) you listed on your FAFSA requesting documents to verify your FAFSA information. The college will not process your financial aid until you provide required documents.
4. Watch for financial aid award notifications. Once you're accepted for admission to the colleges you listed on your FAFSA, they will notify you of the types and amounts of financial aid they're offering.

## TEST FEES

Registration for the ACT without writing is $\$ 52.00$. ACT with writing costs $\$ 68.00$.
Juniors and Seniors qualifying for $F / R$ Lunch may see Mrs. Houston for a fee waiver.

What you need to know about scholarships
Most scholarships are based on academics, but others are based on community service, school involvement, or talent. Some are based on financial need as determined by the results of your FAFSA.
Here's where to look for scholarships:

1. ScholarshipQuest at EducationQuest.org houses over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. After you create a profile, you'll be matched with scholarships that fit your criteria.
2. Your email. Check your email regularly to check on local and national awards sent from Mrs. Houston.
3. The college you plan to attend. Contact the school for a list of scholarships they provide and the application procedures.
4. National search sites such as College Board, Peterson's, and Chegg.
5. Other resources could include your coach, clubs and organizations, and your parents' employers and civic organizations.



## Follow these tips for Scholarships!

- Organize scholarships in deadline order and set aside time each week to work on them.
- Focus on college-based and local scholarships. You're more likely to earn them over large national awards.
- On the application, list your activities, awards, honors classes and volunteer or paid jobs.
- Earn the best possible ACT scores by taking the exams in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.
- If an application requires a letter of recommendation, give the person writing the letter plenty of notice, a specific deadline, and a list of your accomplishments and activities.
- After writing an essay, ask an English teacher to review it.
- Don't ever pay for scholarship services!

Lewiston Consolidated School Survey
During the month of February, parents, students, and school staff will have an opportunity to complete a climate survey for Lewiston Consolidated Schools. The Nebraska Department of Education provides an on-line perceptual survey program that allows school district's the opportunity to survey parents, students, and school staff to measure perceptions of the school climate. Survey results will then be averaged across each subgroup and displayed as charts to enable districts to assess areas of strength and areas needing improvement.

We are asking parents to please take the time to share your thoughts and feelings about school climate by completing the survey. Instructions for completing the survey will be sent to parents by text message through the district's notification system in early February. Students and staff will be given access and asked to complete the survey at school.


PBL: Three students have joined PBL this semester. They are working on a variety of projects that range from preparing food (waffles, chocolate chip cookies, desserts) to slime. They are being challenged to explore their passions, research, plan, and build, prepare, learn about something new to them.

FOODS 2: This class has eight sophomores that love to cook. Soups and sandwiches started off the year preparing the students to help with the LCS Soup Supper later in the month. Units in preparing beef, poultry, pork and fish rounded out the month of January.

TEXTILES 2: Students are working on a community project sewing aprons for the Pawnee Historical Society. This project also teaches them additional sewing skills in addition to using skills learned in Textiles 1.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT: This class covers the physical, emotional, and social development of children infants to 6 years. This month will be the simulation of caring for a newborn using the "Baby-Think-It-Over" dolls.

SENIOR SURVIVAL SKILLS: Seniors will begin their Financial Unit this month with budgeting, bank accounts, savings, and learning about credit. They will be using Foundations Digital, an online curriculum from Dave Ramsey to learn about being financial solvent as well as an online banking simulation from Financial Literacy Project. These two programs are valuable for our students to learn how to be financially sound.

INDEPENDENT FACS: This class provides a place for students to explore their interests in FACS. This month they will be working in the area of Home Living Outdoor Landscaping by cleaning up the area behind the FACS room.
