


Students will be divided into 2 groups and alternate between STEM activities and a story time with a chance to check out library books.


For students that will be in 7th-12th Grades at Lewiston

Lewiston will be adopting new school regulations in regards to the consumption of energy drinks at school. Those updates will be announced soon. Please stay updated on information on the impact energy drinks have on student health.



## The Buzz on Energy Drinks

What Is an Energy Drink?

- A beverage that typically contains large amounts of caffeine, added sugars, other additives, and legal stimulants such as guarana, taurine, and L-carnitine. These legal stimulants can increase alertness, attention, energy, as well as increase blood pressure, heart rate, and breathing.<sup>14</sup>
- These drinks are often used by students to provide an extra boost in energy. However, the stimulants in these drinks can have a harmful effect on the nervous system.<sup>5</sup>

#### The Potential Dangers of Energy Drinks

In 2011, 1,499 adolescents aged 12 to 17 years went to the emergency room for an energy drink related emergency.<sup>6</sup>

Some of the dangers of energy drinks include<sup>1</sup>:

- Dehydration (not enough water in your body).
- Heart complications (such as irregular heartbeat and heart failure).
- Anxiety (feeling nervous and jittery).
- Insomnia (unable to sleep).

#### How Much Caffeine Is Okay?

 The American Academy of Pediatrics states that caffeine and other stimulant substances contained in energy drinks have no place in the diet of children and adolescents.<sup>9</sup>

#### What Can You Do?

- Teachers and other school staff can educate students about the danger of consuming too much caffeine, including energy drinks.
- Coaches can educate athletes about the difference between energy drinks and sports drinks and potential dangers of consuming highly caffeinated beverages.
- School nutrition staff can provide only healthy beverages such as fat-free/low-fat milk, water, and 100% juice if extra items (i.e., a la carte items) are sold in the cafeteria.
- Parents, school staff, and community members can join the school or district wellness committee that sets the policies for health and wellness and establish or revise nutrition standards to address the sale and marketing of energy drinks in school settings.
- Everyone can model good behavior by not consuming energy drinks in front of kids.

#### Energy Drink Recommendations for Adolescents

- The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that adolescents do not consume energy drinks, yet between 30– 50% reported consuming energy drinks.<sup>1,3</sup>
- The National Federation of State High School Associations recommends that young athletes should not use energy drinks for hydration, and information about the potential risk should be widely distributed to young athletes.<sup>10</sup>

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### Lewiston Consolidated Schools School Board Meeting Minutes June 15, 2022

A regular meeting of the District 69 Board of Education, Pawnee County, was held on Wednesday, June 15th, at 7:30 p.m., the meeting being open to the public and proceeded in notice as required by law. Notice of this meeting was given to the President and all members of the Board and a copy of the acknowledgement of notice and the agenda is noted in the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated to the public in advanced notice and to the President of the Board and all Board members. The meeting was called to order, the Open Meetings Law poster recognized, and verbal notice that the meeting was recorded was given by the President. Roll call recognized the following members as present: Bredemeier, Howell, Rule, Searcey, and Wehrbein. Excused Absence: Schuster.

Also present: Rick Kentfield and Juli Smith.

The agenda was reviewed. Moved by Howell and seconded by Wehrbein "to approve the agenda as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Howell, Rule, Searcey, Wehrbein, and Bredemeier. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

There were no visitor comments.

Moved by Searcey and seconded by Howell "to approve the consent agenda as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Rule, Searcey, Wehrbein, Bredemeier, and Howell. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Moved by Wehrbein and seconded by Searcey "to approve the purchase of a partial lot in Lewiston from Billy Gaddy in the amount of \$2,000 per the legal description presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Searcey, Wehrbein, Bredemeier, Howell and Rule. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Moved by Howell and seconded by Wehrbein "to approve the carpet bid from Jim's Carpet in the amount of \$7,061.25 as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Wehrbein, Bredemeier, Howell, Rule, and Searcey. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Juli Smith, Principal, reported on new curriculums and highlighted a long list of great things that are taking place at Lewiston Consolidated Schools.

Rick Kentfield, Superintendent, distributed 22-23 handbooks for the boards review, reported on state negotiation data and the alumni banquet.
