



Nolan Janssen demonstrates water pollution during the STEM activity July 6.




Mary Moser shows how a watershed works as part of "Our Blue Planet."





Introducing some of our new teachers!

From Mrs. Angie Hunzeker:



Greetings! I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself by telling you a little bit about where I come from.

I have 23 years of teaching experience in secondary education. I graduated from Peru State College in 1999 with a degree in secondary education with endorsements in 7-12 English and special education. In 2012, I earned a

Extracurricular Programming assignments were reviewed. Summer Projects were reviewed. Progress on the Vocational Agricultural Building project was discussed.




